Waste Management Requirements

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1. Overview

This Waste Management Requirements Registry details the legal and other requirements (such as permits and plans) that the City and County of Denver (CCoD) is subject to on the Federal, State and local level. It is intended to outline these requirements from their source (such as the United States Code) to specific documents and actions that must take place in order to meet the requirements (such as permits, compliance reporting, and record keeping).

There are many aspects, including routine activities or items, at CCoD facilities that have the potential to impact waste management. These aspects are identified in the most recent version of Environmental Aspects and Impacts Assessment.

To address the legal and other requirements created by these aspects, CCoD operates the following programs:

1. Municipal Facility Compliance Program (addresses compliance for air, stormwater, hazardous waste, other regulated waste, above ground and underground storage tanks);
2. Meth Labs Program (addresses hazardous wastes, air emissions, and health issues associated with methamphetamine labs);
3. Environmental Stewardship Program (addresses proactive means of reducing environmental impacts).

Additionally, CCoD has created and published several Environmental Guidelines (EGs) to assist in controlling the aspects referenced above to minimize impacts to waste management. A list of EGs can be found in the Environmental Guideline Process and Catalog.
