DHS Vision: Partnering with our community to protect those in harm's way and help all people in need.

The Family Crisis Center (FCC) is a program that offers hope and opportunity for the children and families served. The FCC has four main program components:

1) Residential care for up to 64 boys and girls ranging from age 10 to 18:

also known as a Therapeutic Residential Child Care Facility (TRCCF)

- Provides youth with a temporary shelter while waiting for permanent placement
- Assesses therapeutic needs of the youth and family
- Utilizes a *clinical systems approach that emphasizes working with the youth's family and environment. Services include psychiatric, drug and alcohol and recreational programming.*

2) Medical Clinic:

In partnership with Denver Health and Hospitals, the program houses a doctor, a nurse practitioner and a registered nurse.
