Early voting for Denver voters starts Monday **Additional locations and later hours add up to more convenience for Denver voters**

(Denver) – The Denver Elections Division reminds Denver voters that early voting for the August 12 Primary Election starts Monday, August 4. Voters will cast paper ballots. Electronic voting machines will be available primarily for use by voters with disabilities if they choose to use them.

Early voting will take place Monday, August 4 to Friday, August 8, 2008. The Denver Elections Division will offer extended early voting hours at its headquarters at 3888 E. Mexico Ave. from 8 a.m. to 7 p.m. on those dates. Twelve other early voting locations will be open from 11 a.m. to 7 p.m. The early voting sites are:

- Christ Church United Methodist Church, 690 Colorado Blvd.
- Denver Elections Division, 3888 E. Mexico Ave. (open 8 a.m. to 7 p.m.)

- Harvey Park Recreation Center, 2120 S. Tennyson Way
- Hiawatha Davis Recreation Center, 3334 Holly St.
- Manual High School, 1700 E. 28th Ave.
- Montbello Recreation Center, 15555 E. 53rd Ave.
- Montclair Recreation Center, 729 Ulster Way
- Rude Park Recreation Center, 2855 W. Holden Pl.
- Scheitler Recreation Center, 5031 W. 46th Ave.

- Tamarac Square Mall, 7777 E. Hampden Ave.
- Webb Municipal Office Building, 201 W. Colfax Ave.

Voters who choose to use a mail-in ballot will also be able to drop off their ballots at the early voting sites if they wish.

Voters who decide to drop off their mail-in ballots at an early voting site are reminded to not drop off ballots outside of the listed hours or at any unsecured location. There is no weekend early voting for the Primary Election.
