**Mail-in ballots on the way to Denver voters who requested them
143,000 plus Denver voters choose mail-in ballot option**

(Denver) – Denver mail-in ballots will start arriving in the mailboxes of voters who requested them as early as today. Mail-in ballots are being mailed out in several large batches over the next three weeks, so voters should not be concerned if their ballot does not arrive right away.

The return postage for Denver's mail-in ballots is \$1.17, and is clearly marked in the box on the return envelope where postage stamps are placed. Voters also have a number of choices for dropping off their completed ballots:

- ◆ Mail-in ballots can be dropped off at any one of Denver's 13 early voting locations, on the dates and times that early voting is taking place. Early voting locations will be open from 11 a.m. to 7 p.m. Monday, October 20, through Saturday, October 25, and from Monday, October 27, to Friday October 31.
- ◆ Mail-in ballots can be dropped off at the Denver Elections Division from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through Friday, prior to early voting. During early voting, the Elections Division will be open until 7 p.m.
- ◆ Denver voters can also drop off their mail in ballots at the early voting locations from 11 a.m. to 7 p.m. on Monday, November 3.

- ◆ Denver voters may also drop off mail-in ballots on Election Day, November 4, from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. at any one of 185 Denver polling locations. Denver is unusual in offering this drop-off service at all polling places on Election Day.

Voters should not leave their ballots at any unsecured location or drop them off outside of the posted hours of operation. Voters should make sure to deposit their ballots in an attended red ballot box only.

Voters who have requested a mail-in ballot before October 6 and don't have it by October 20, or, voters who have requested a mail-in ballot after October 6 and don't have it by October 27, can call 311 to obtain a replacement ballot.
