### Meeting Summary

#### 1. WELCOME

Frank Locantore welcomed the steering committee members and walked the committee through the meeting agenda.

#### 2. VISION STATEMENT DEVELOPMENT ACTIVITY: EQUITABLE, AFFORDABLE, AND INCLUSIVE

Liz Weigle presented an analysis of public input related to the Equitable, Affordable, and Inclusive vision element, which focused on housing. The input came from an online survey, in-person mapping exercises, and other engagement activities. The analysis also included existing conditions data. The vision element was broken down into three subtopics: affordability, housing options, and housing quality. The analysis identified key opportunities for housing in the future. Steering committee members then wrote on sticky notes what their vision was for housing in the East Central area in 2040. The notes were used to prompt a discussion with the committee about their housing vision. Notes from the discussion will be presented with the draft vision statement at an upcoming steering committee meeting.

#### 3. VISION STATEMENT DEVELOPMENT ACTIVITY: WELL CONNECTED, SAFE, AND ACCESSIBLE PLACES

Jason Morrison presented an analysis of public input related to the Well Connected, Safe, and Accessible Places vision element, which focused on mobility. The input came from an online survey, in-person mapping exercises, and other engagement activities. The analysis also included existing conditions data. The vision element was broken down into four subtopics:

pedestrians, cars, bikes, and transit. The analysis identified key opportunities for mobility in the future. Steering committee members then wrote on sticky notes what their vision was for mobility in the East Central area in 2040.
