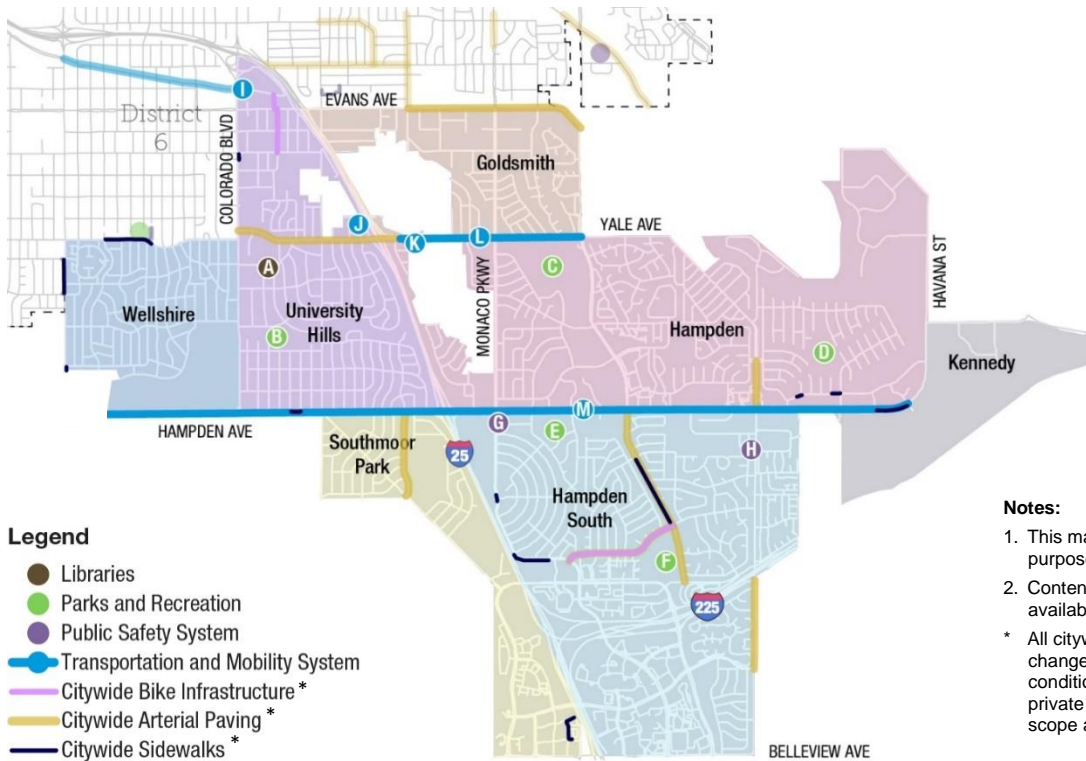


ELEVATE DENVER BOND PROGRAM COUNCIL DISTRICT 4 PROJECTS

Current Status	Project Name and Description
A Development	Ross-University Hill Library: Replace outdated equipment and renovate space
B Development	Eisenhower Neighborhood Park and Recreation Center: Replace picnic areas, replace aging systems, and address recreation center deferred maintenance
C Development	Bible Neighborhood Park: Replace aging playground equipment and upgrade asphalt paths to concrete
D Development	Hampden Heights Neighborhood Park: Upgrade asphalt paths to concrete
E Development	Southmoor Neighborhood Park: Upgrade asphalt paths and replace basketball courts
F Development	Rosamond Neighborhood Park: Replace outdated playground equipment and basketball courts
G Development	Fire Station 22: Retrofit restrooms to be gender equitable
H Development	Fire Station 13: Refurbish kitchen space
I Development	Buchtel and Colorado Boulevard Intersection and Colorado Station Bike/Pedestrian Access Improvements: Reconstruct intersection and add protected bike lanes and pedestrian safety features
J Development	Yale Station Pedestrian Safety: Improve pedestrian safety features and enhance access to public transit
K Development	High Line Canal: Construct new underpass for High Line Canal Trail at Yale Avenue
L Development	Yale Avenue Improvements: Improve traffic signal operations, sidewalks, and bicycle lanes.
M Development	Hampden Corridor Multimodal Improvements: General improvements to enhance traffic flow, including additional safety features and access to public transit
