NOTICE OF FILING OF APPLICATION
TO INCREASE THE ENHANCED 9-1-1 EMERGENCY TELEPHONE CHARGE

The Denver Emergency Communications Center, 1437 Bannock Street, Suite 350, Denver, CO 80202; at phone number: 720-913-2025, has applied to the Colorado Public Utilities Commission (PUC) for approval to increase the current monthly Enhanced 9-1-1 surcharge affecting all users of exchange telephone, wireless, wireline, and voice-over-internet-protocol (VoIP) telephone services within the City and County of Denver from \$0.70 to \$1.20. The proposed effective date of the increase is November 1, 2018.

The requested surcharge increase is necessary to purchase and maintain modern, more feature-rich, equipment and systems replacing equipment and systems which were or are at the end of their useful life and secure additional personnel in order to meet or exceed national performance standards, as allowed by Colorado law (C.R.S. 29-11-102 and 104). Denver is requesting an expedited PUC decision.

The deadline for filing interventions or objections is: Monday August 20, 2018

The Commission will consider all written comments and objections submitted prior to the evidentiary hearing on the application. If you desire to participate as a party in any proceeding before the PUC regarding this filing, you must file written intervention documents at the PUC, 1560 Broadway, Suite 250, Denver, CO 80202 in accordance with Rule 1401 of the PUC's Rules of Practice and Procedure or any applicable PUC order.

The PUC may hold a public hearing in addition to an evidentiary hearing on the application. If such a hearing is held, members of the public may attend and make statements even if they did not file comments, objections or an intervention. If the application is uncontested or unopposed, the PUC may determine the matter without a hearing and without further notice.
