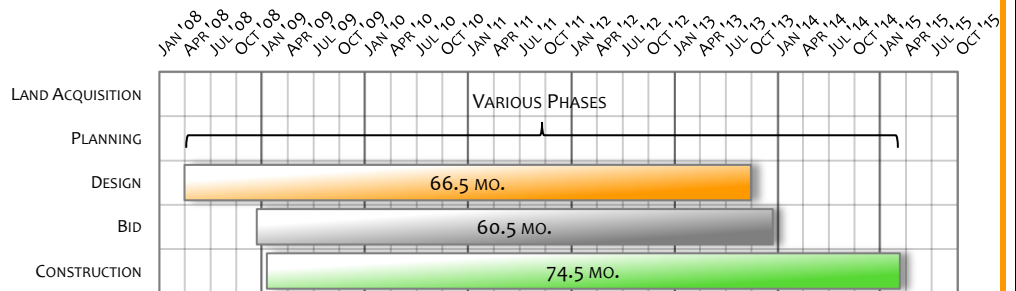


Project Overview

Project Scope

The Better Denver Bond Program funded a number of improvements within City Park, which has been an important Denver landmark since the 1880s. The renovations improved safety, sustainability and wildlife habitat, while making the park more enjoyable to use and easier to maintain. This collection of City Park projects included updates to existing irrigation systems; circulation improvements aimed at enhancing compatibility among pedestrian, running, cycling, and vehicular routes; restoration of Duck Pond and construction of an adjacent pedestrian boardwalk; updates to fixtures and finishes within the historic City Park Pavilion; and restoration of the east meadow adjacent to the Denver Museum of Nature & Science.
