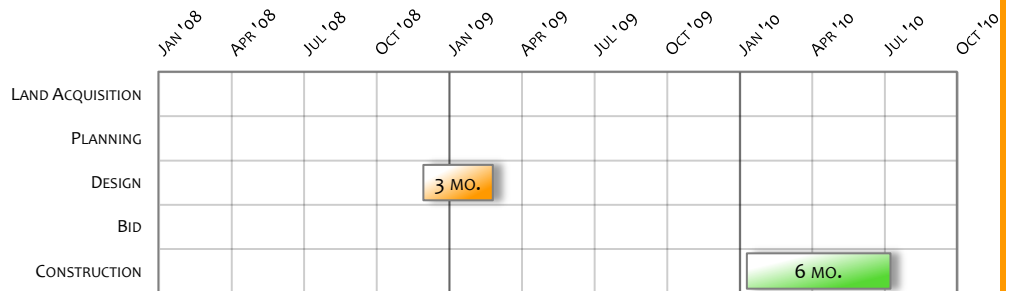


Project Overview

Project Scope

Renovation work at the Montbello Branch of the Denver Public Library comprised upgrades to existing fire protection and mechanical systems, restoration of aging skylights, recoating of the structure's standing seam roof, reconfiguration of interior spaces to enhance circulation, updates to interior finishes and furnishings, procurement and installation of self-check stations, as well as installation of a radio frequency identification (RFID) system. Together, the self-check and RFID technologies allow for automated self-check of library media and provide numerous benefits including improved circulation/collection management, reduced theft of library materials, increased efficiency of library staff, and an enhanced customer experience.
