

Commission Legislative Committee Process Flow Chart

State Legislative Session Begins

Commissions identify bills through:

- Existing committee work
- CLC monthly conference calls or weekly legislative e-mail updates.

Commissions discuss relevant policies and decide to either:

NO
Commission votes to
not make a
recommendation

GO
Commission votes to
make a
recommendation

TRACK
Commission votes to
continue tracking
legislative for possible
future action

Commission chair or designee completes the "Legislative Recommendation Form" and submits it with rationale addressing why this bill impacts your community AND how it impacts City Operations in DENVER.
Mark Support, do not Support, or Continue Tracking

Email Recommendation form to Commission Legislative Committee Liaison, and HRCP's Executive Director. HRCP's Executive Director will forward it to the Mayor's Office legislative team.

Mayor's legislative team provides HRCP with decision (up to 2 weeks typical—plan accordingly) and shares with commission.

City agrees and is taking a
supportive stance on proposed
legislation/City opposes
proposed legislation and will take
an opposition stance

The City is not taking a position on
the legislation but is tracking the
legislation.

Commission can share the City's stance and can provide testimony at the Capitol if requested by Mayor's Office.

No further action required.
