

Park Hill Golf Course Steering Committee

If selected for the steering committee, members should expect to meet 12 to 14 times over the next 15 to 20 months (roughly once a month). Each meeting will last approximately two hours.

Meetings will be conducted virtually via Zoom.

Selection Criteria

The ideal committee size is approximately 25 participants.

Applications will be considered based on how well they meet the following criteria:

- Belonging to a racial or ethnic minority group
- Including neighbors who live within ½-mile of the golf course
- A broad range of ages
- Gender diversity and
- Income diversity.

Additionally, a well-rounded steering committee should include differing viewpoints that represent the variety of opinions held within neighborhoods. Applications will be considered with the goal of including advocates for

- Parks and open space
- Nearby religious and educational institutions
- Affordable housing
- Mobility
- Youth and family advocacy
- Locally owned businesses
- Community groups and
- Neighborhood organizations.

As the property owner, Westside Investment Partners is allowed one representative to participate in steering committee discussions but will have no other role in reviewing or selecting members.

Using the criteria above, the executive directors of Community Planning and Development and Denver Parks and Recreation – Laura E. Aldrete and Allegra “Happy” Haynes – will jointly approve steering committee membership.
