
Two-Way CONVERSION

PROJECT PROGRESS

As of the end of December 2017, the project is 60 percent finished and is scheduled to be completed by the end of May. The crews will be working along 19th Avenue to address the protection of bike lanes and parking.

Crews have completed the following work:

- New stop signs have been placed on the intersection of 19th Avenue and Sherman Street, and 19th Avenue and Grant Street to help control oncoming traffic equally.
- Intersection work on 19th Avenue and Lincoln Street.
- Concrete work and removal of traffic signals on 20th Avenue.
- Curb extensions on Grant Street and 19th Avenue.

UPCOMING WORK

- From Broadway to Grant Street, crews are going to extend fourteen concrete curbs. The extended curbs will help create protected bike lanes and parking on 19th Avenue. The phase will last until mid-February.
- Asphalt mill and overlay on 19th Avenue from Broadway to Park Avenue. This phase is expected to start in April.
- Road and bike lane striping work will start end of April.
- Utility relocation crews will continue to work in various locations on 19th Avenue, they will be relocating the aerial utilities to underground.

SCHEDULE AND TRAFFIC IMPACTS

Normal working hours are Monday through Friday, from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. No weekend work is expected. Business and resident access will be maintained during construction. Detour signs will be posted. All work is weather dependent and subject to change.

Xcel Energy is in the process of replacing the street lights that were removed along 20th Avenue. The work is expected to end the first part of February.

PARKING IMPACTS

Street parking near active construction zones will be removed 24 hours a day while crews are occupying the work area. The parking meters will be bagged and parking will not be allowed.

SIDEWALK IMPACTS

Sections of the sidewalks in the construction zone will be closed mostly near the street corners. Signed detours will be in place to guide pedestrians around the closed areas. Access to businesses and residences will be maintained.

OVERVIEW

In July 2017, Jalisco International, Inc., along with the City and County of Denver, began a two-way conversion project north of downtown. The project will convert 19th and 20th Avenues, between Broadway and Park Avenue West, from one-way streets to two-way, bi-directional streets. The new two-way streets will also have integrated bicycle lanes. Grant and Logan Streets, between 18th and 20th Avenues, will also be converted to a two-way vehicular operation.

This project will not only improve connectivity, but also increase safety through improved bicycle and pedestrian facilities, provide calm traffic in an increasingly residential area, and enhance neighborhood character with consistent street patterns.
