



COMMUNITY CENTURY GARDEN: Renewal/Spiral Timeline




Plan View



- (A) (B) (C) Sliding Graphic Panels - 40"x40" high pressure laminate panels mounted on individual 120" tracks
- (D) Fixed Backwall Graphic Panels - 1qty. 80"x40", 1qty. 40"x40" high pressure laminate panels
- (E) Vitrines - 5 qty. , 3" deep glass top enclosed display cabinets. Three 40" wide cabinets contain maps printed on 10"x 30" panels. Two 28" cabinets display artifacts (by others)
- (F) Archive Display Drawers - 5qty. 6" deep drawers, two 28" wide, three 40" wide. Artifacts viewable only when open, each drawer to have secure plex cover.
- (G) Glass Enclosed Cabinets/Shelves - secured glass enclosures with LED interior lighting— for all shown.
- (H) Spacer and Reveal - equal each end between exhibit structure and finished as built walls.
- (I) General material and finish of cabinetry TBD. Estimate as: 1-hardwood with satin sealed stain 2-wood substructure with high pressure laminate.



First Tee

E Vitrine/Glass Cases: CPGC Legacy—maps, photos, and interpretive text

To demonstrate the transformation of CPGC from the natural links to park links, display the plans horizontally in exhibit cabinetry, oriented east/west (like the golf course). Plexiglas overlays printed with photos and narratives interpret the era each plan view represents and progresses through time as one moves from the entry to the café and pro shop.




D Timeline Back Wall: Century Wall / Golfing Legacy

Challenge visitors to place themselves on the City Park Golf Course timeline and assume their role in stewarding the course for future generations—make the past relevant to people's experience of the course today.


C Present Timeline Back Wall: Icon Golf Course and Transformation of CPGC & golf



Display Shelves with Glass Fronts: Select trophies and 3-D artifacts

Cycle of continuity & growth overtime

Beneath the plans, in the pull-out file drawers, select existing 2-D items, documents, and smaller objects would be arranged in conjunction with the appropriate time period. These items would be displayed beneath protective plexiglas with photos and narrative and be viewable by pulling out a labeled drawer.


