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**FIRE ON THE MOUNTAIN** is the first certified green restaurant in the West Highlands neighborhood. Not only do they serve hormone-free, antibiotic free, cage-free chicken, but they also compost and recycle! Over 80% of their waste has been diverted away from the landfill. And that's not all; even their used fryer oil gets collected and turned into biodiesel fuel. Fire on the Mountain supports and makes contributions to local nonprofits focused on the health of people and the planet. Their commitment to sustainability transfers to their customers as well; they offer discounts for customers who make the effort to bike, walk, bus, or take alternative transport.

## TRANSPORTATION

- Adopted an anti-idling vehicle policy
- Encourage employees to use RTD, bike, walk
- 5% discount for biking, walking or bus
- Contract with grease haulers that recycle grease to biofuels

## RESOURCE MANAGEMENT

- Purchase 100% recycled content paper with at least 30% post consumer content
- Recycle all cardboard, mixed paper and co-mingled containers
- Implement a composting program
- Purchase 10% of food products from locally grown/produced sources
- All take-out packaging is compostable
- Provide recycling and composting to neighboring apartments
- Switch from individual condiments to refillable containers
- Send used toner cartridges back to manufacturer
- Set printer and copier defaults to double sided
- Bar is made from Pine Beetle wood
- Interior paint is Eco-Spec low VOC paint.

## WATER CONSERVATION

- Installed low-flow toilets that save 1.9 gallons per flush
- Installed sink aerators that save up to 3.5 gallons per minute

## ENERGY EFFICIENCY

- Replaced lighting
- Installed programmable thermostats
- Installed low-emissive coating to windows to minimize use of heating and cooling system
- Establish a written operations and maintenance plan for refrigeration equipment

## BUSINESS MANAGEMENT

- Verify compliance with all applicable environmental regulations
- Employee handbook details their commitment to environmental stewardship

## WASTE DIVERTED

- Diverted 82.66% of their waste from the landfill
- Collected 32,495 pounds of recycling
- Collected 99,498 pounds of compostable material

## CONSERVED

- 113 trees
- 3,090 gallons of oil
- 46,751 gallons of water
- 28,381 kWh of electricity
- 98 cubic yards of landfill space
- Created 65 cubic yards of beneficial compost
- Avoided 20,614 pounds of greenhouse gas emissions
