Vote & Return Early

Voters are strongly encouraged to vote and return their ballots as early as possible, taking care of voting early avoids waiting at a vote center on Election Day. Ballots began mailing to active voters on October 15, 2018. Voters that register online before October 29, 2018 will receive a mail ballot, voters registering after that date must visit a Voter Service and Polling Center to cast a ballot. All ballots must be received by our office before 7pm on November 6, 2018.

 - Accessible voting devices
 - Voter registration

Ballot TRACE

Voters are encouraged to sign up for the Denver Elections Division’s award-winning Ballot TRACE (Ballot Tracking, Reporting, And Communication Engine) service, to track the status of their mail ballot before it enters the mail system, while it is being processed by the U.S. Post Office, and after it has been returned to the Denver Elections Division. Voters can retrieve updates through www.pocketgov.org/BallotTRACE or may choose to receive updates by email or text message.

- ◆ Ballot TRACE is an award-winning, innovative mail ballot tracking, reporting and communication engine developed for Denver’s mail-in ballot voters by the Denver Elections Division.
- ◆ Ballot TRACE provides reports about the status of all mail-in ballots to the Denver Elections Division officials so they can be assured that ballots sent to voters are delivered in a timely fashion.
