Office of the Clerk & Recorder

The Elections Division of the Office of the Clerk and Recorder provides comprehensive election services for the City and County of Denver including voter records, election operations, election administration, and communications. The mission of the Division is to conduct fair, accurate, accessible, secure, transparent, efficient, and reliable elections.

Departments of the Elections Division:

Administration Department provides budget and purchasing management, project management, campaign finance management, graphic design coordination, records and reference material coordination, facility coordination, training coordination, and administrative and operative support. The Administration Department is also responsible for election judge coordination including recruitment, on-boarding, and off-boarding processes.

Communications Department provides media relations, community outreach, candidate and campaign relations, legislation coordination, website coordination, and strategic public information support for elections.

Operations Department provides voting operational support, ballot production, voting site management, election supply and equipment management, election technology coordination including the development of database applications that support election functions, voting system management, security system administration, address library maintenance, internal election management systems and logistical field support. The Operations Department is also responsible for the preparation of standard and customized reports and maps, and tabulation and compilation of election results.

Voter Records Department is responsible for ballot processing management, voter registration management, canvass coordination, petition management, correspondence coordination, SCORE II system coordination, voting process coordination, and customer relations coordination. Voter Records is also responsible for the group residential facility voting process and the military and overseas voting program.

Programs of the Elections Division:



Ballot TRACE is an award-winning, innovative mail ballot Tracking, Reporting, And Communication Engine. It utilizes the Postal Service's intelligent mail barcode technology to track a mail ballot envelope from the time it is printed, through every stage of the U.S. Postal System, and after it has been returned to the Denver Elections Division.



eSign or Electronic Signature Image Gathering Network is a cutting edge application that has transformed the petition process - providing easier access to the ballot and efficiencies never seen before in this country. Petition circulators gather signatures using a tablet and stylus.

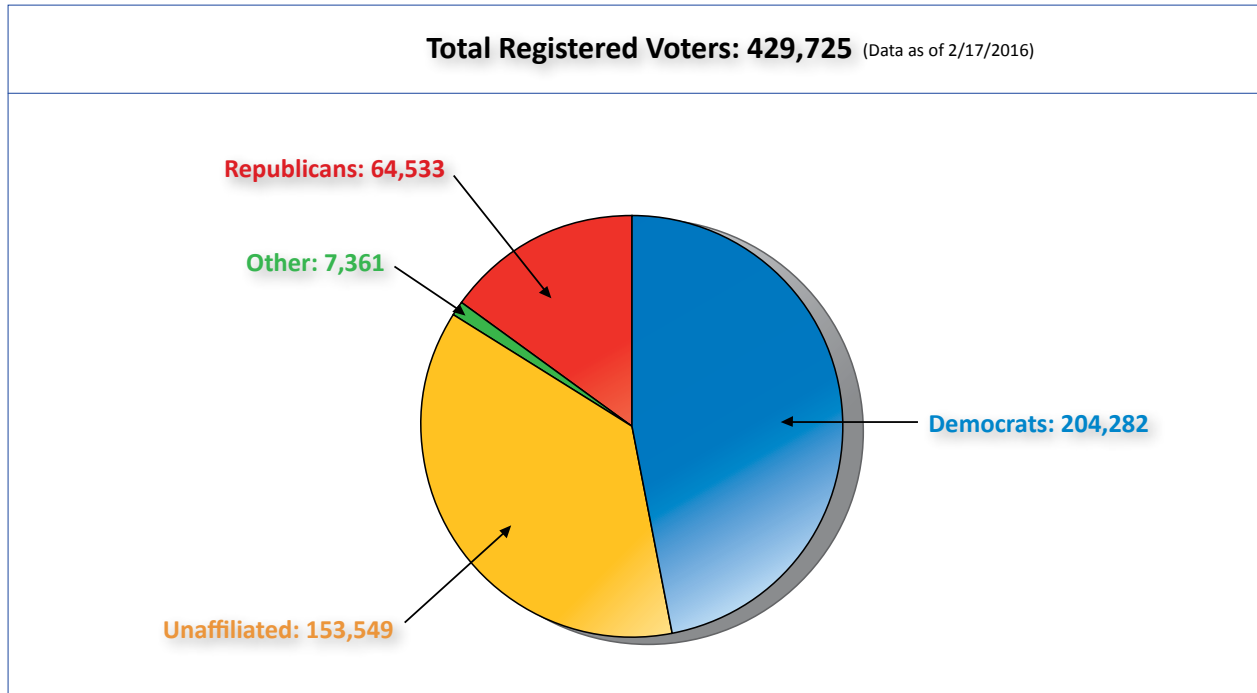


CEO or Civic Engagement Opportunity is a high school election judge program geared towards students 16 years of age or older, currently attending high school (or home school) and in Junior or Senior standing. Students are trained by the Denver Elections Division and work alongside other election judges at one of our voting locations across Denver or at the Denver Elections Division's main office downtown.



Denver Works is a program that encourages registered voters in the City and County of Denver to serve in various temporary election judge assignments during an election cycle. The hard work and commitment of Denver's election workers ensures that voters in the City and County of Denver are provided with fair, accurate, accessible, secure, transparent, efficient, and reliable elections.

Types of Elections:


- Presidential Elections: every four years, the next is November 2016
- Gubernatorial Elections: every four years, the next is November 2018
- Primary Elections: in coordination for each of the above
- Municipal Elections: every two years, the next is May 2017
- School Board/Coordinated Elections: every two years, the next is November 2017
- Special Ballot Initiative and Special Elections: when needed
