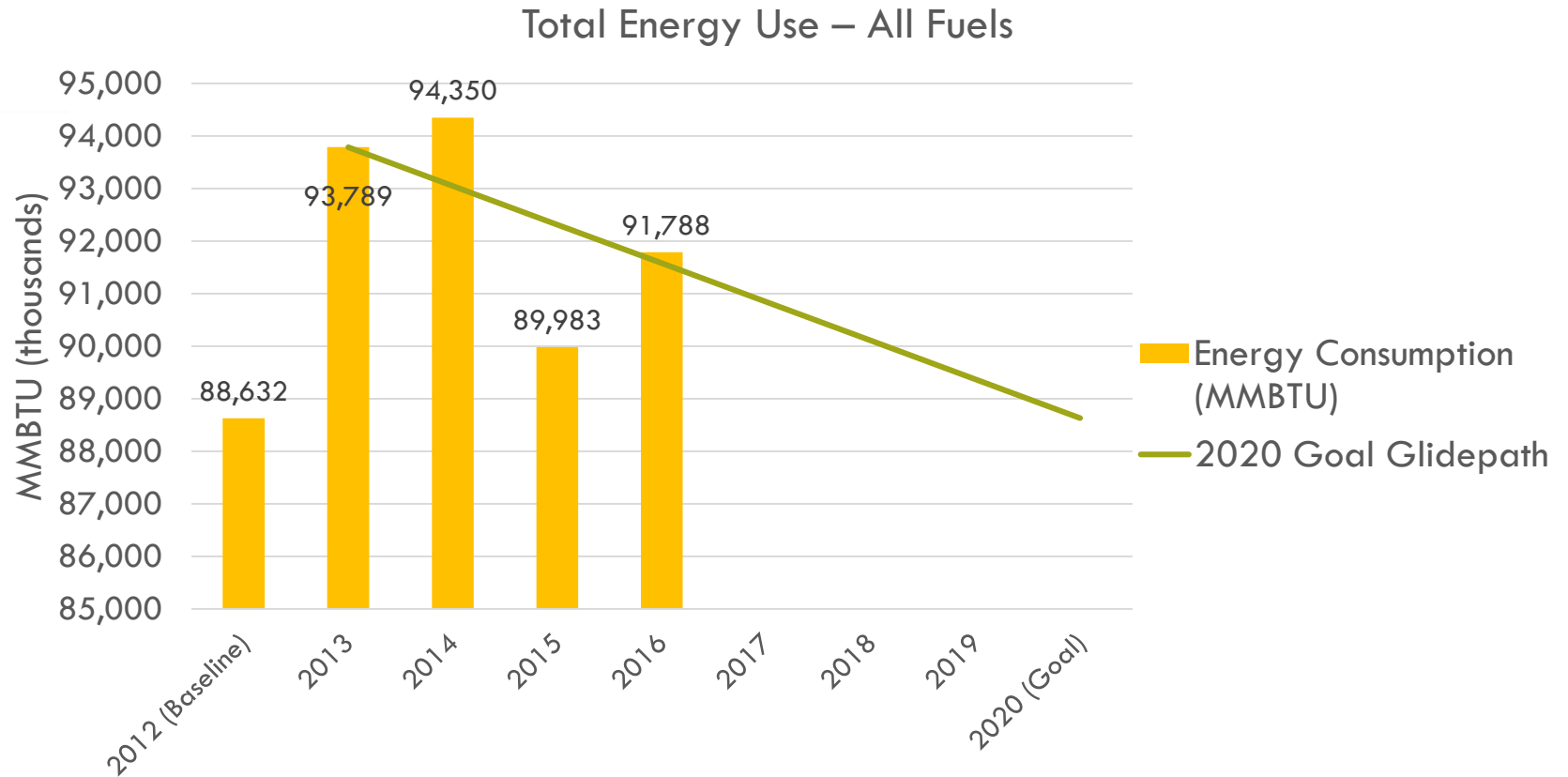

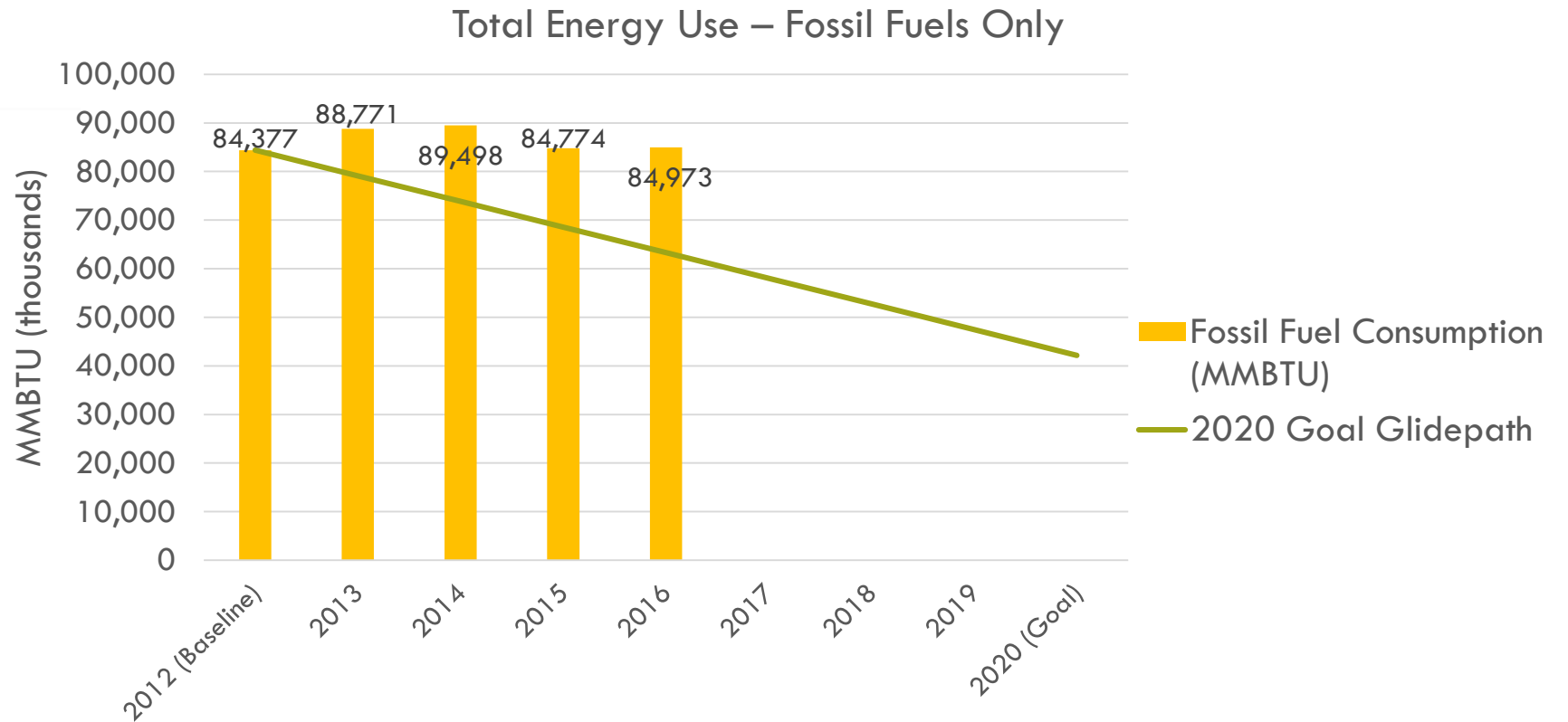

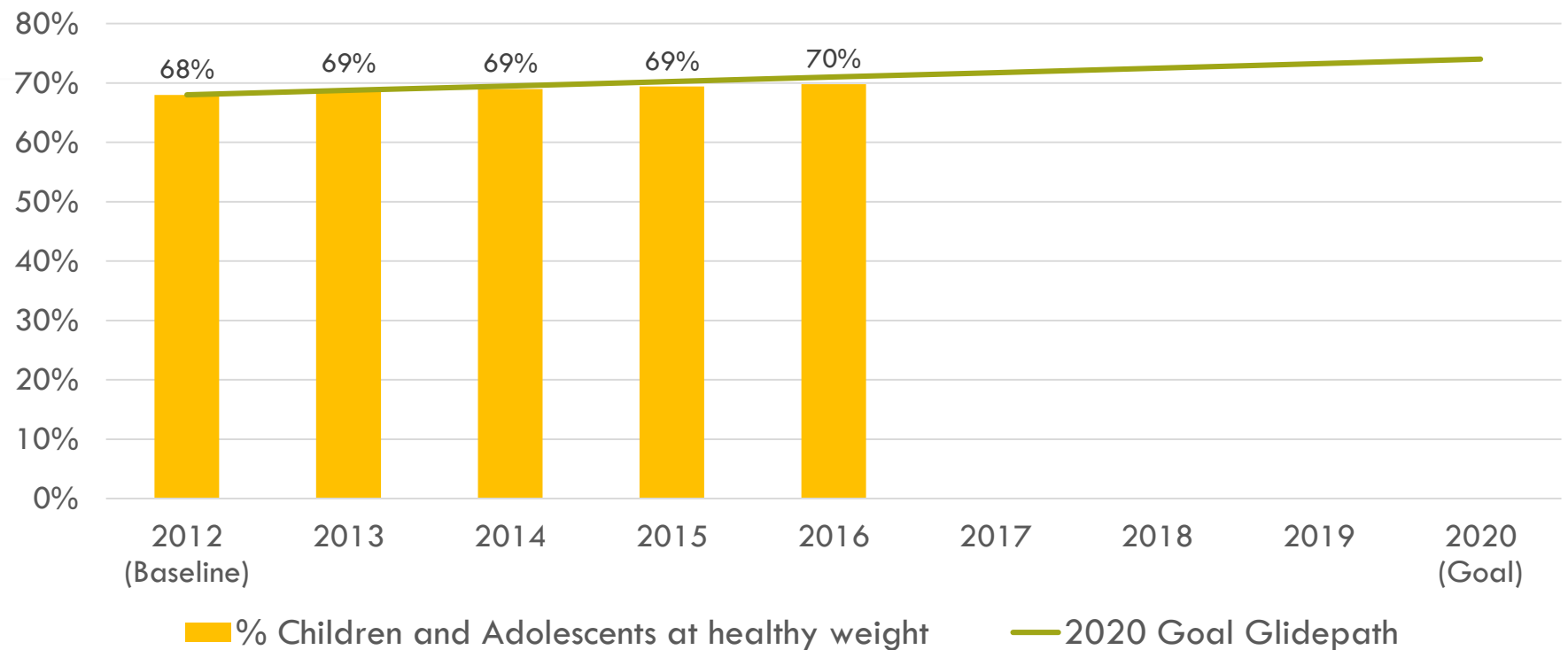

Health Community

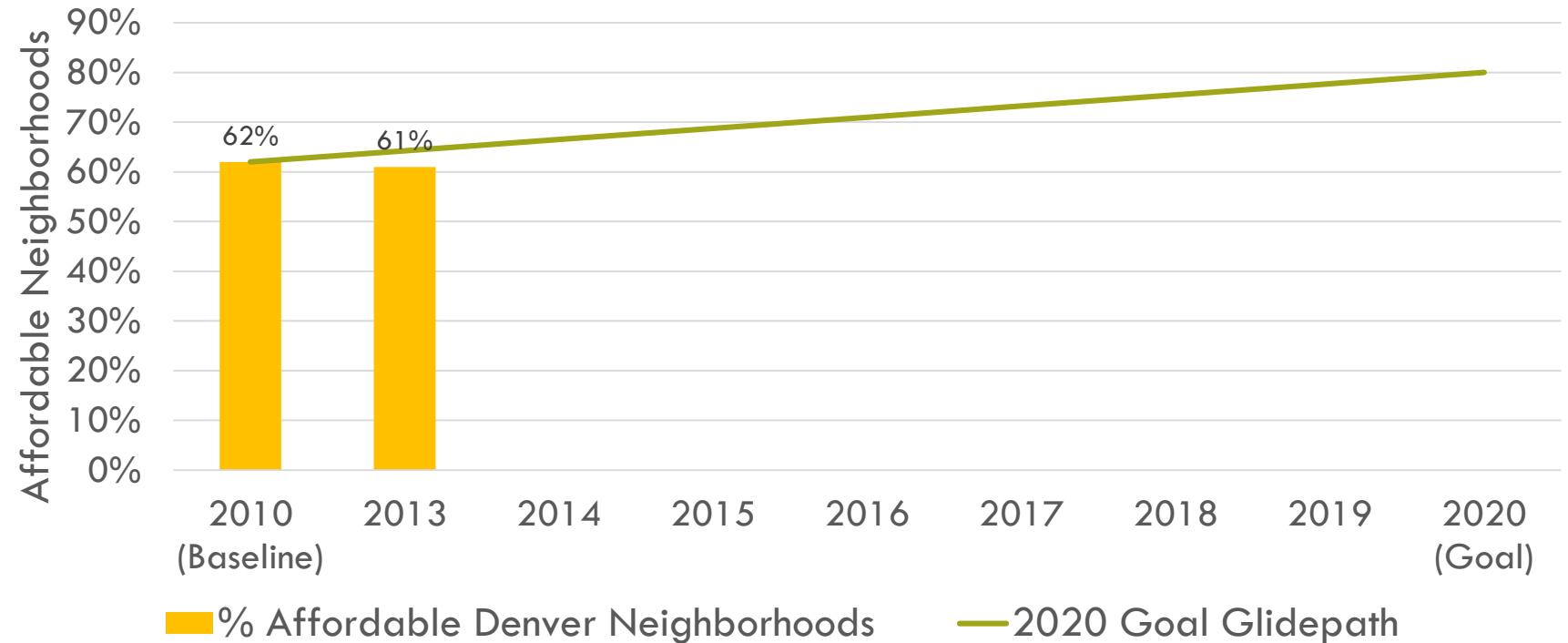
Increase the percentage of children and adolescents in Denver who are at a healthy weight from 69% to 74%.

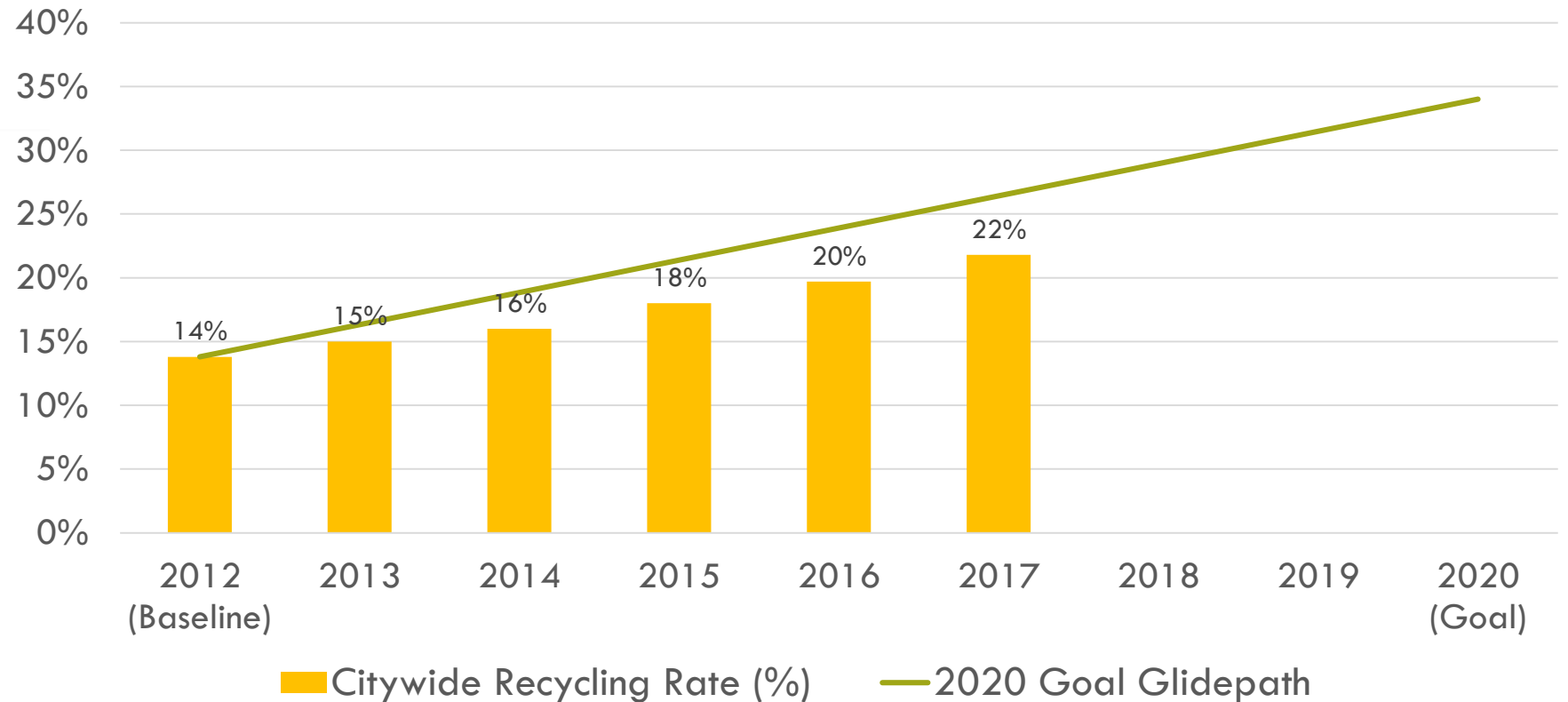

Materials Community

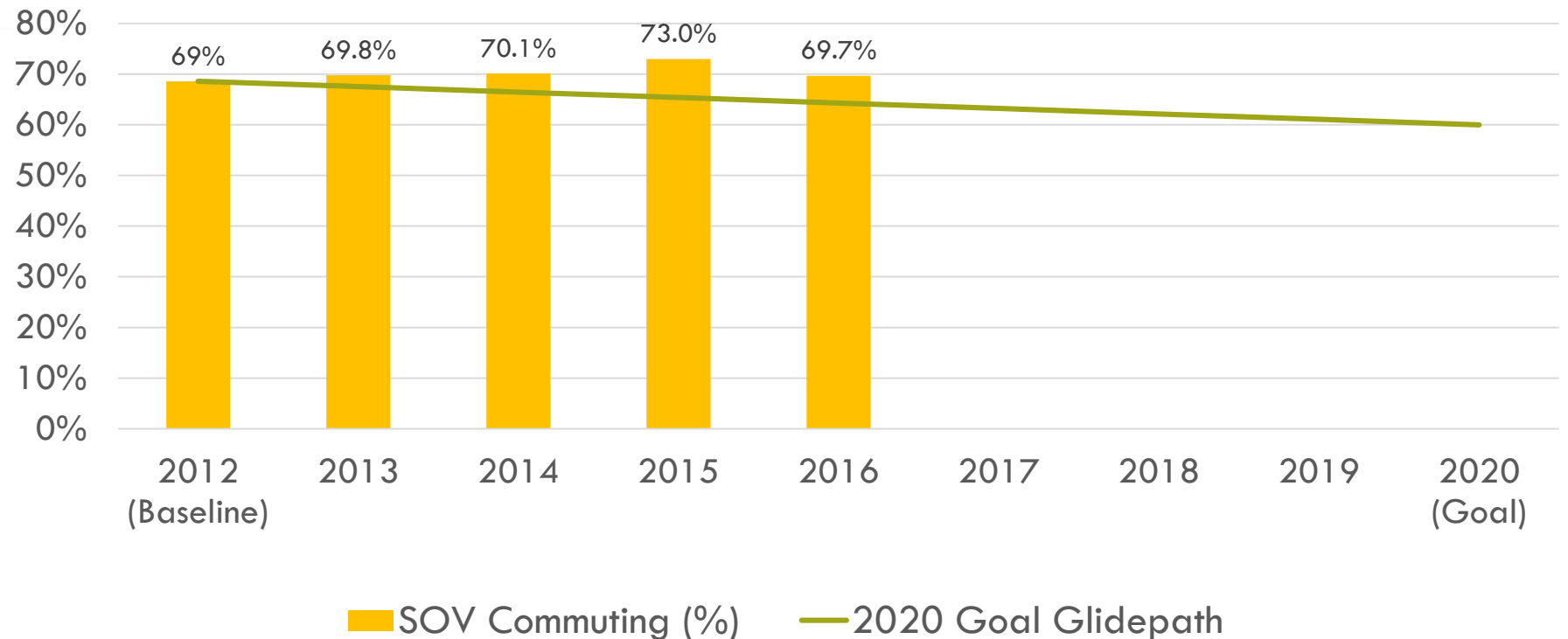
Increase the citywide recycling rate to 34% or greater.

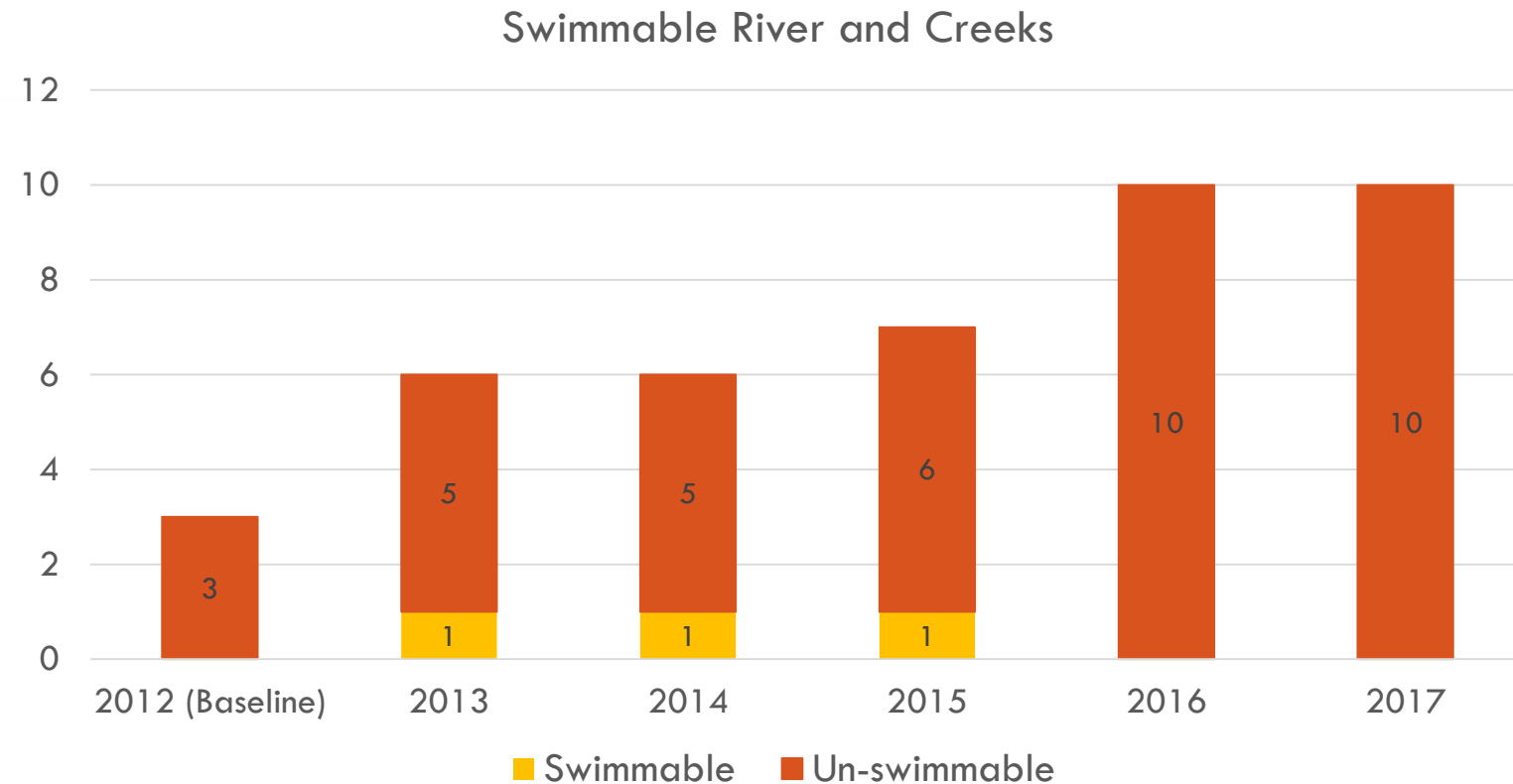

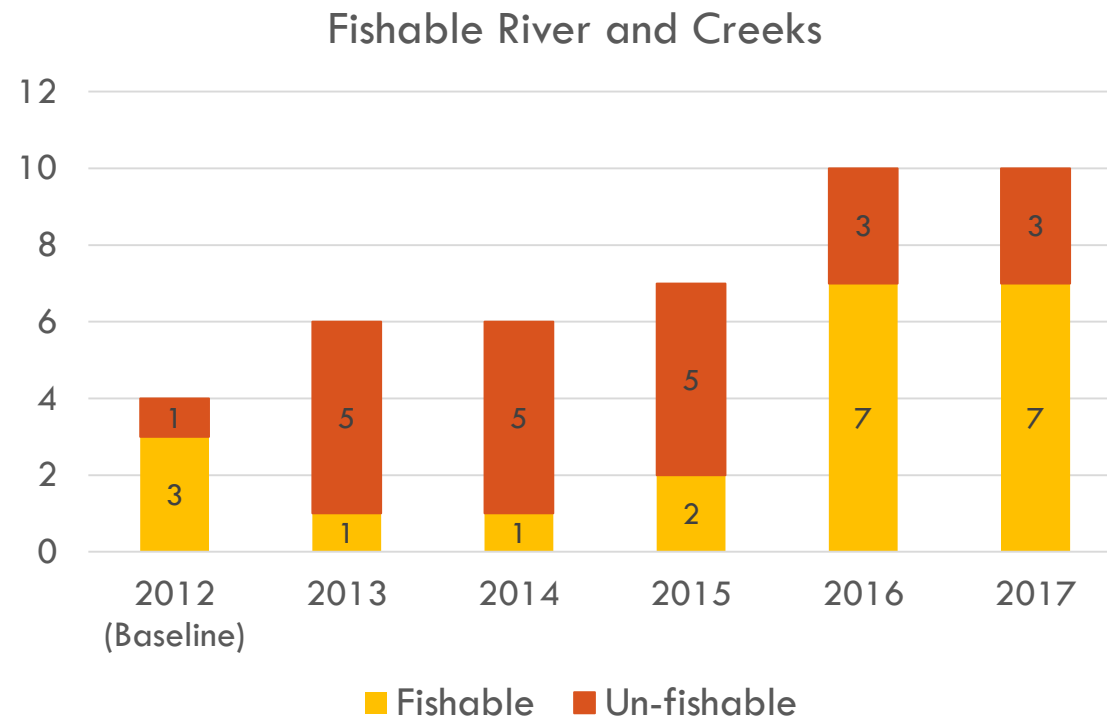

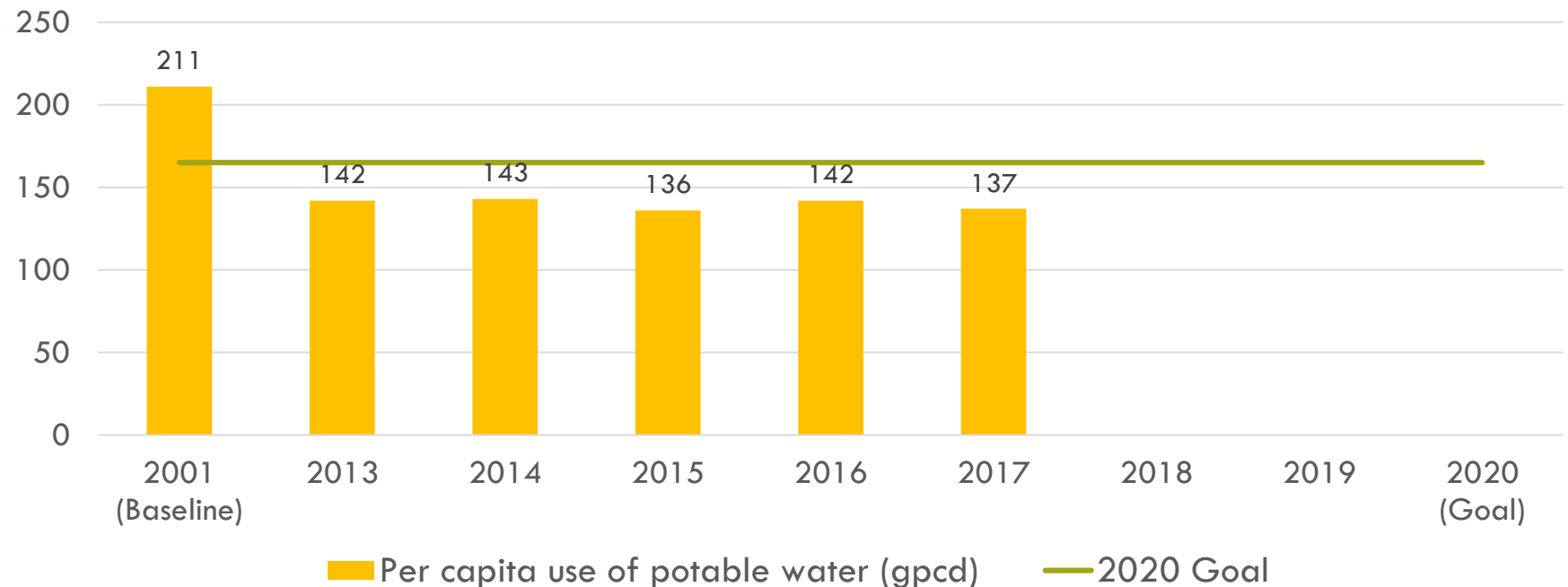
