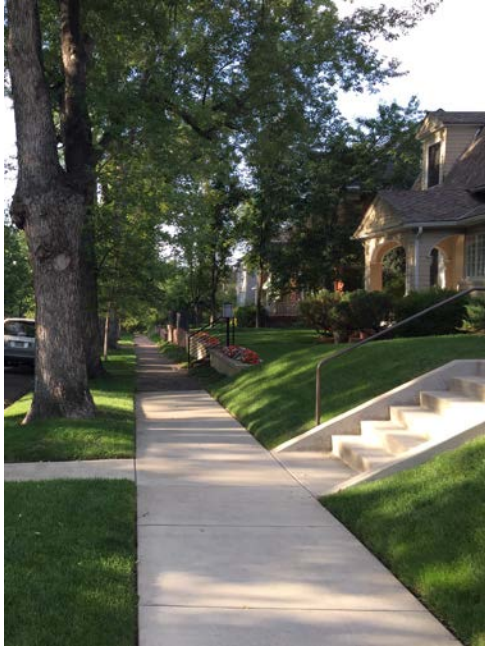

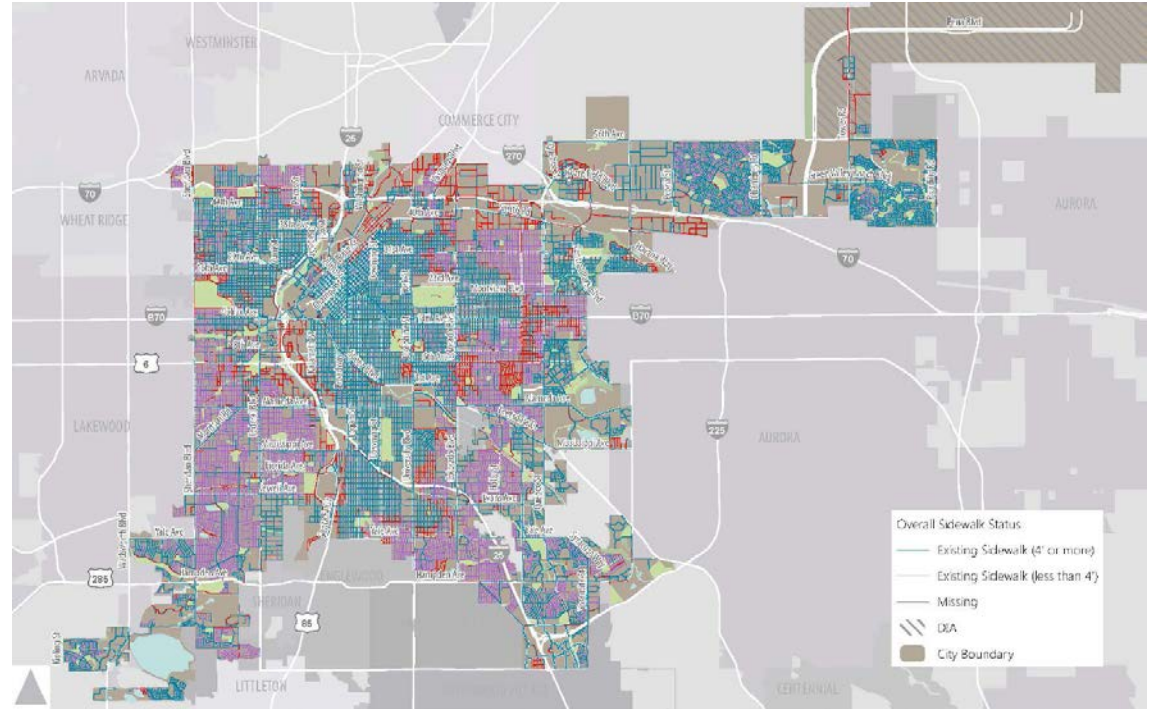

Streets with

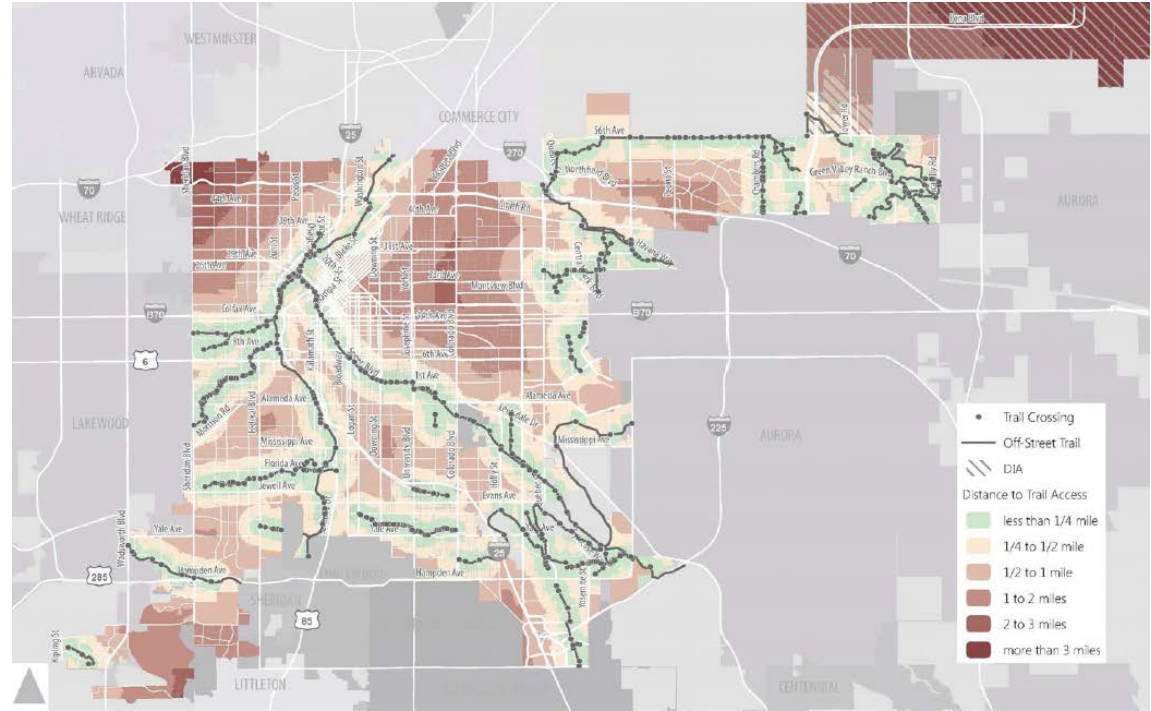
- Existing sidewalks – **60%**
- Too narrow sidewalks – **30%**
- Missing sidewalks – **10%**



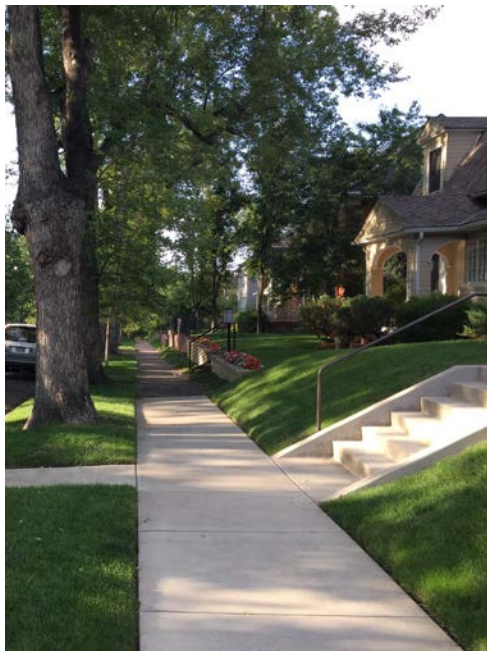
Trails in Denver

Draft Pedestrian Priorities

Start with:

- Missing sidewalks
- Sidewalks near transit
- Sidewalks near schools



Draft Trails Priorities

Start with:

- New trails
- Widening of trails that are much too narrow
- New or improved connections to on-street bikeways

- General Obligation Bond
- Presenting for authorization November 2017
- \$31 million citywide for sidewalks
- Other pedestrian projects
- Trails projects
