SUPPLY SHORTAGES AND RE-SUPPLY:

For Denver hospitals: 0/6 project staff shortages in coming week; 0/6 project shortage of N95 respirators, masks, positive air pressure respirators, gloves, eye protection and gowns in next two weeks. No hospitals report acute pharmaceutical shortages at this time.

OLDER ADULTS/PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES RESIDENTIAL FACILITY OUTBREAKS OF COVID-19 (April 30 AM):

CDPHE defined "Outbreaks"= 31 (unchanged).

TESTING:

CDPHE plans to release dashboard with county totals of both positive and negative PCR tests. Surveys of other testers underway to develop daily testing estimates for the city. Denver is not intending an antibody-based strategy at this time.

A draft CONOPS for a "specimen collection team" has been drafted. A draft proposal for more universal testing of asymptomatic shelter people experiencing homelessness is in process.

DHHA has acquired COVID-19 testing technology for inpatients, hospital, first responders and essential City staff. Two new test sites (by appointment only) added (SW and NE). Current daily testing approx. 550/day but awaiting test kits to raise to 1000/day. Several hospitals using commercial labs, but all for symptomatic

<p>Transportation</p>	<p>DOTI - Dept. of Transportation & Infrastructure (Latest Update/Review 4/30)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Traffic on City streets rising slowly closely to 70% of normal volumes. - Street sweeping began 4/1, but no citations will be issued during April. - Multiple street closures have been implemented (starting 4/4) to create more space for residents to exercise while practicing social distancing. - Solid Waste reports increased waste volume - likely resulting from Stay-at-Home order. <p>RTD (Latest Update/Review 4/30):</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Riders directed to limit time at stations and stops to 10 minutes and maintain social distancing while waiting for transit. - Capacity limited to ~15 passengers per bus (~20 on larger buses) to maintain social distancing. If necessary, buses will bypass stops if social-distancing capacity is reached. Additional buses and staging of buses added as necessary and as available.
