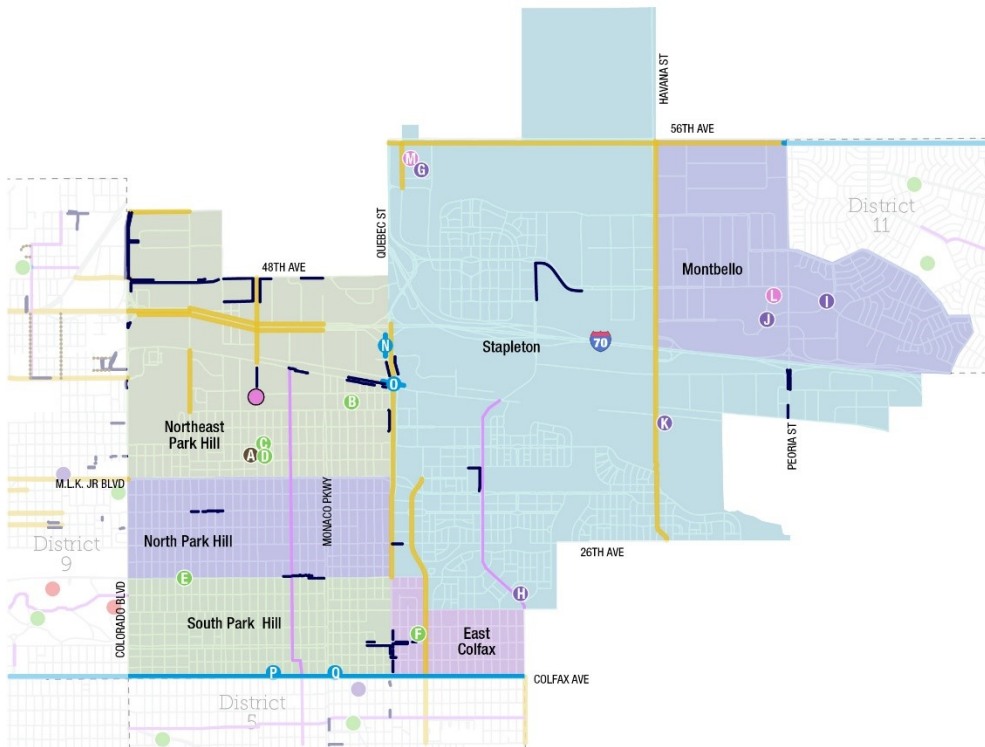


ELEVATE DENVER BOND PROGRAM COUNCIL DISTRICT 8 PROJECTS

G	Development Fire Academy: Roof and window replacement
