2017 General Obligation Bond Meeting Minutes

Meeting Notes

Public Comment

- Eleven members of the public spoke regarding the following projects: Alameda underpass, 47th and York bike/ped bridge, walkability improvements along Santa Fe, multimodal improvements in Westwood, improvements to the 23rd Avenue bridge, and Evans/Jewell bike/ped bridge.

Agency Presentation of Projects

- Department of Public Works presented proposed transportation and mobility projects.
- Discussion regarding deferred maintenance (also referred to as critical system needs in the presentation) in the City which includes bridges, roads, and curbs/gutters. The total cost to address all critical systems needs would be about \$226 million. Specific projects identified included: bridge rehabilitation and maintenance, the 8th Avenue bridge, re-paving arterial and collector streets, and installing curb/gutter.
- Discussion regarding projects which support build-out of the mobility network and improve city's existing bike, pedestrian, and transit networks. Specific projects identified include the 47th and York bike/ped bridge, 16th Street Mall improvements, a Colfax bus rapid transit corridor, Broadway multimodal improvements, and funding for more protected bike lanes.
- Discussion regarding multimodal facilities which improve both street conditions and provide bike and pedestrian options. Specific projects identified included: the 38th Street underpass, 56th Avenue, Broadway and Kentucky intersection improvements, Peoria Street improvements, Quebec Street improvements, and Washington Street improvements.

Wrap-up

- At the April 13 meeting, city staff will present on projects submitted by the public. At the April 20 and April 25 meetings, the group will focus on refining and finalizing the project evaluation criteria and building consensus around projects. The remaining meetings will be used to prioritize projects and develop a transportation and mobility package to recommend to the executive committee.
