Motion by Heidi Majerik: I move to recommend that City Council approve this official Text Amendment to the Denver Zoning Code to implement Expanding Housing Affordability zoning incentives coordinated with changes to the Denver Revised Municipal Code, and correct minor errors and omissions from other recently adopted zoning code text amendments, finding that all applicable review criteria have been met. Second by Erin Clark.

Condition to the motion offered by Fred Glick: ... that the enhanced incentive parking exception be expanded to include zone lots within one quarter mile of transit priority corridors. Amendment seconded by Gosia Kung. Deliberation by Joel Noble, Gosia Kung, and Ignacio Correa-Ortiz. Vote: 5 against (J. Noble, A. Fouther, E. Clark, I. Correa-Ortiz, H. Majerik) and 3 in favor (M. Susman, G. Kung, F. Glick). Motion fails.

Original motion without condition passes unanimously, 8-0.

Joel Noble moved to add a recommendation: I move that Planning Board further recommend that the City Council expeditiously evaluate where existing established frequent transit is operating and to expand the incentive parking exemption availability to these areas in a near-future amendment. Seconded by Heidi Majerik.

Amendment offered by Erin Clark: that the motion substitute the word 'promptly' for 'expeditiously'. Amendment accepted by motioner and seconder.

Board deliberation by MaryBeth Susman, Ignacio Correa-Ortiz, Angelle Fouther, Gosia Kung & Fred Glick. Amendment offered by Fred Glick that the recommendation read: I move that Planning Board further recommend that the City Council promptly evaluate expanding the enhanced incentive parking exemption availability to areas surrounding existing and planned Transit Priority Streets in a near future amendment. Heidi Majerik withdraws second. Joel Noble withdraws original amendment. Joel Noble offers amendment: I move that Planning Board further recommend that the City Council promptly evaluate expanding the enhanced incentive parking exemption availability to areas surrounding existing and planned Transit Priority Streets. Seconded by MaryBeth Susman.
