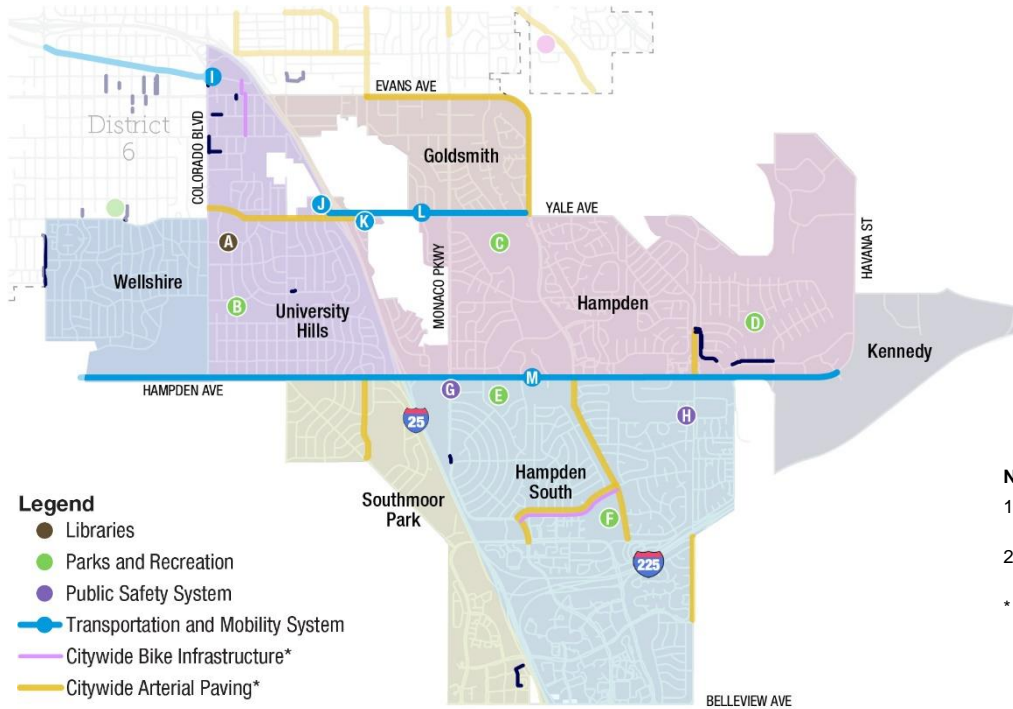


ELEVATE DENVER BOND PROGRAM COUNCIL DISTRICT 4 PROJECTS

A Development	Ross-University Hill Library: Replace outdated equipment and renovate space
B Development Complete	Eisenhower Neighborhood Park: Replace picnic areas Eisenhower Recreation Center: Address recreation center deferred maintenance
C Complete	Bible Park: Replace aging playground equipment and improve walkways
D Complete	Hampden Heights Neighborhood Park: Upgrade asphalt paths to concrete
E Development	Southmoor Neighborhood Park: Upgrade asphalt paths and replace basketball courts
F Design	Rosamond Neighborhood Park: Replace outdated playground equipment and basketball courts
G Complete	Fire Station 22: Retrofit restrooms to be gender equitable
H Construction	Fire Station 13: Refurbish kitchen space
I Design	Buchtel & Colorado Boulevard Intersection Improvements: Reconstruct intersection and add protected bike lanes and pedestrian safety features
J Complete	Yale Station Pedestrian Safety: Improve pedestrian safety features and enhance access to public transit
K Development	High Line Canal: Construct new underpass for High Line Canal Trail at Yale Avenue
L Development	Yale Avenue Improvements: Improve traffic signal operations, sidewalks, and bicycle lanes
M Phase I Complete Phase II Development	Hampden Corridor Multimodal Improvements: General improvements to enhance traffic flow, including additional safety features and access to public transit
