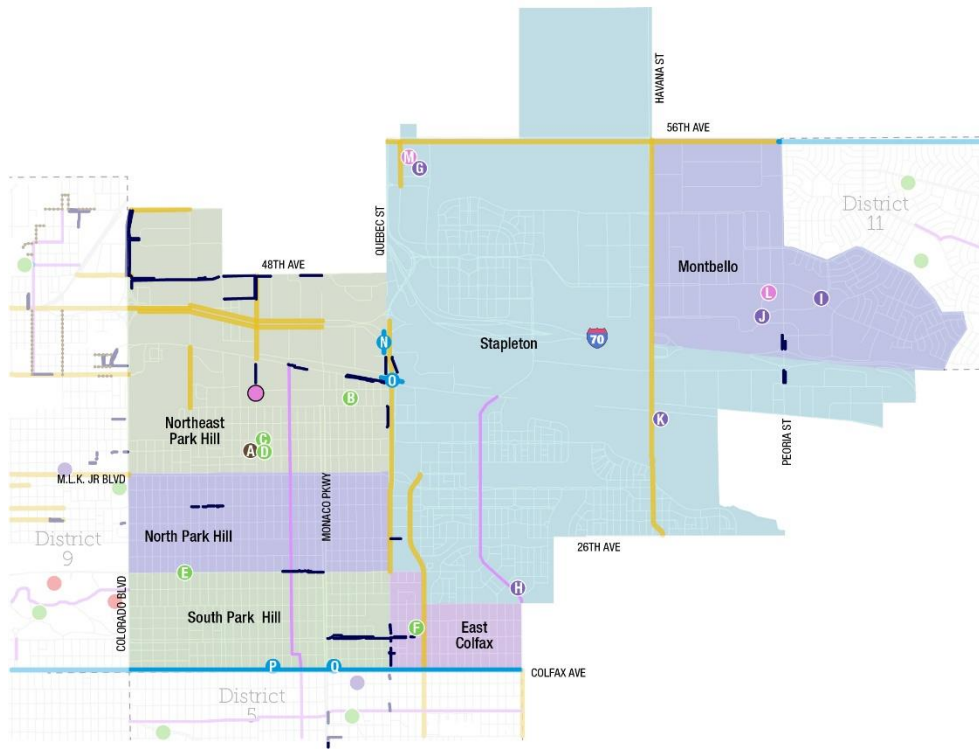


ELEVATE DENVER BOND PROGRAM COUNCIL DISTRICT 8 PROJECTS

B Complete Development	MLK Jr. Neighborhood Park: Upgrade asphalt paths to concrete MLK Jr. Recreation Center: Upgrade recreation center facilities
C Development	Skyland Neighborhood Park: Replace three tennis courts and four pickleball courts
D Construction	Hiawatha Davis Recreation Center: Upgrade facilities
E Development	Ferguson Neighborhood Park: Replace outdated playground equipment
F Complete	McNichols Neighborhood Park: Replace outdated playground equipment
G Development	Fire Academy: Roof and window replacement
H Complete	Denver Police Academy: Address deferred maintenance
I Complete	Fire Station 27: Retrofit restrooms to be gender equitable and refurbish kitchen space
J Construction	Police Station District 5: Renovate the building and replace roof
K Complete	Denver County Jail: Upgrade fire sprinkler system

M Construction	Roslyn Complex Upgrades: Replace outdated equipment and renovate

P Design	Colfax Bus Rapid Transit (BRT): Add exclusive bus lanes, new transit stops, and other improvements to allow the BRT to operate efficiently and effectively
