



Pool Facility Operator, Licensee or Owner,

In an effort to avoid health risks to the public and violations that may result in enforcement action, including temporary closure of a pool facility, it is necessary that operators, licensees or ownership, fully understand the following requirements pertaining to the operation of your pool facility.

Pool facilities having any of the conditions below shall be closed immediately:

1. Disinfection level below minimum requirement of 1.0 part per million (ppm) for chlorine, 1.5 ppm for bromine and 20 ppm for hydrogen peroxide.
2. pH below the minimum requirement of 7.2, or above the maximum requirement of 8.0.
3. Insufficient water clarity results in the main drains not being clearly visible from the deck, or the main drain grates are missing or are not securely fastened in place.
4. The emergency phone or equivalent alarm system is not available, not easily accessible, or is malfunctioning.
5. Any other condition determined by the Manager to pose an imminent public health risk, such as a missing or inoperative anti-entrapment device.

Violations that create an imminent health hazard or closure of the facility may result in up to a \$5,000.00 fine.

Repeat violations of the rules and regulations within a 12-month period may result in a summons to court or an administrative citation.

As a representative, owner, or operator of a Pool, Spa or Body of Water within the City and County of Denver, I understand that I am responsible for complying with the City and County of Denver Pool Rules and Regulations, Chapter 51 and Chapter 24 - Denver Revised Municipal Code, which can be found at www.denvergov.org/healthinspections.
