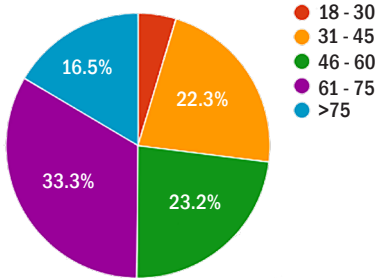




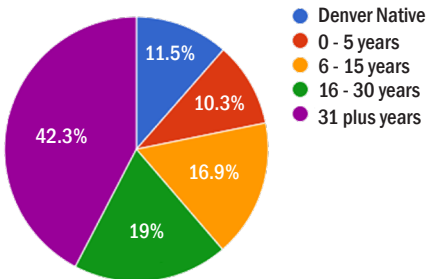
SOUTHEAST DENVER SURVEY RESULTS | 2020

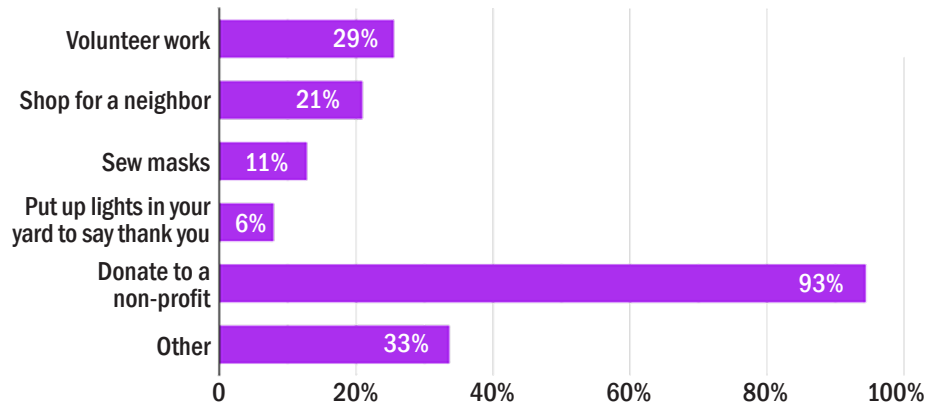
We received responses from all age groups

56% increased online shopping

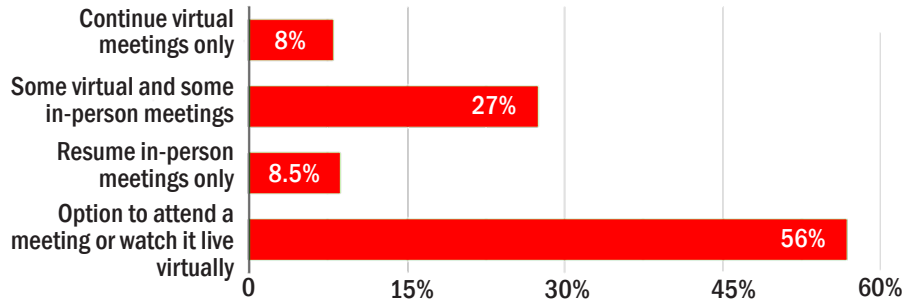


13% had no change in the way they shop

MOVING FORWARD

45% of survey takers are comfortable attending in-person community meetings if proper sanitation, social distancing and mask wearing are enforced



SUSTAINABILITY

This spring when many people were working from home, air quality around the world greatly improved. Now with more people on the roads, air quality has worsened.

During the pandemic, there has been an increase in take-out restaurant food and home deliveries. Most items are packaged in plastic and cardboard.

88% are concerned about Denver's air quality

78% are willing to drive less

70% are concerned about the increase of waste

33% use the city's green compost bin

84% use the city's purple recycle bin
