Healthy Homes Program

Our homes are important places where we eat, live, and breathe. It is necessary to regularly check homes for any signs of decline or issues that may be impacting our family's health and safety.

Energy Outreach Colorado's free Healthy Homes Program is focused on the health and well-being of the household, with the goal of making every participant's home safer and more comfortable.

PROGRAM BENEFITS

- Free test of your home's air quality
- Free advice from experts and recommendations for improvements
- Free upgrades that address any identified home air quality problems
- Step-by-step support during the installation process
- Improved air quality and a safer home
- Lower pollution and lower impact on climate change

YOU MAY QUALIFY FOR THIS PROGRAM IF:

- Someone in your household has a breathing condition
- You live in the city and county of Denver
- You rent or own a single-family home, townhome, duplex, or mobile home
- Your household has a total income at or below 80% of AMI (see chart below)

Healthy Homes Program Frequently Asked Questions

How is this program funded? The City and County of Denver funds this program through the Climate Protection Fund (CPF) and the Office of Climate Action, Sustainability, & Resiliency (CASR).

How much funding is available? EOC was granted \$4 million over the next three years. EOC anticipates serving 100 homes and spending \$30,000-\$50,000 per home, depending on what is installed.

How do people apply? Healthcare providers can refer eligible households to EOC or individuals can reach out directly with interest by emailing healthyhomes@energyoutreach.org. EOC will complete an initial phone screening to determine eligibility of referrals or interested parties.

How will it work? EOC will walk eligible participants through the entire process from application to final inspection. EOC will schedule an energy and home health assessment to determine what the home needs. The work will then be completed by our trusted contractors.

What data will be measured? Measurements include particulate matter, temperature, humidity, carbon monoxide, carbon dioxide, dust allergens, & radon.

Free upgrades could include:

- **Weatherization:** bathroom & kitchen aerators, low flow showerheads, LED light bulbs, programmable thermostats, air sealing, refrigerator, attic insulation, crawlspace insulation, wall insulation
- **Healthy Homes:** vapor barrier, exhaust fans, range hood, radon mitigation, moisture control and/or mitigation, mold abatement, asbestos abatement, induction range, duct cleaning, increased attic ventilation, pest control, hard surface flooring
- **Electrification:** heat pumps, electric dryer, dryer venting, electric hot water heater, electrical panel upgrades to handle the load of the upgraded electric appliances

What else may be provided?

- HEPA filter vacuum, green cleaning products, and air purifiers
- Education of new equipment installed in the home: info on why it was installed how to use it, cooking and cleaning instructions, and energy saving tips
- Subscription to a Community Solar Garden (CSG) to save on electric bills
