

## LEGEND



Three criteria must be met for a property to be considered significant with respect to historic designation of a district. The first is that the structure must be built within the specified time period (prior to 1930 for the proposed Wyman district). The second is that the structure must retain its original facade and roofline such that no major removals or additions have negatively affected the appearance. The third requirement for a property to be considered significant is that it have historical or architectural significance.

As stated above, a stucture that meets all criteria is considered significant. If only two of the three are met, the structure is considered contributory. Achieving one criteria merits potentially contributory, while none met renders the structure noncontributory.

Evaluation of the properties in the proposed Wyman district produced a remarkable 74.59% at contributory or better. The complete statistics are as follows:
