



SIDEWALK CONSTRUCTION

PROJECT BACKGROUND

The Sidewalk Construction Program aims to address essential missing links in Denver’s sidewalk network to help people get where they want to go safely and with ease. With more than 300 miles of sidewalk gaps in the City, those prioritized for construction are locations along high-injury corridors providing access to transit, schools, grocery stores and parks. This project constructs missing sidewalks within three parks and in three neighborhoods with connectivity to the Vision Zero High-Injury Network and parks.
