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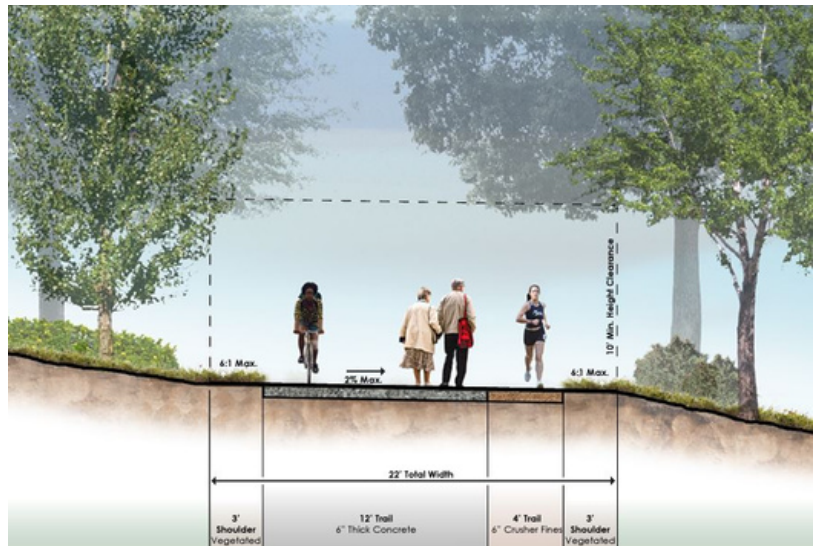
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*As with all design and construction projects schedule indicated above is an estimate only. Many factors can cause delays in the delivery of the project, and schedules are subject to change.

Brief project description

This project will widen and improve a 4,000-foot-long stretch of the South Platte River Trail between Bayaud Avenue and Phil Milstein Park. Improvements will feature a widened 12-foot-wide concrete trail with an adjacent 4-foot-wide crusher fines trail and shoulders with vegetation on each side. About 2,500 linear feet of new trail will be constructed on the west side of the river, away from I-25. The project also includes a new 16' wide bike and pedestrian bridge, trail lighting, wayfinding, and construct a pedestrian plaza between the trail and the river adjacent to Denver's Wastewater Management building.
