



## July 17<sup>th</sup>, 2022 OIS Video Release

The Denver Department of Public Safety received complaints of officer misconduct concerning the July 17<sup>th</sup>, 2022 officer-involved shooting at Larimer Street and 20th Street in which bystanders were injured. Pursuant to C.R.S. 24-31-902(2)(a), after a complaint of peace officer misconduct is made, and following a request, the appropriate law enforcement agency is required to release all unedited video and audio recordings of the incident within 21 days. Since a complaint has been made and the recordings have been requested, the Department of Public Safety is releasing the recordings of the shooting. These recordings can be accessed [here](#).

A critical incident briefing video can be found [here](#). This briefing is intended to provide transparency and context regarding the incident based upon the information obtained through the investigation to date.

The Denver District Attorney's Office notified the Department of Safety that this incident is being sent for review by a Denver grand jury. The grand jury will review the details of this incident and determine if the officers' actions were in compliance with Colorado law.

After that determination, a Sergeant from the Internal Affairs Bureau will present the incident to the Use of Force Review Board which is made up of community members, DPD command officers, and a member of another Colorado Law enforcement agency. If policy violations are identified by the Use of Force Board and Chief of Police, the case is then investigated by the Internal Affairs Bureau and sent to the Conduct Review Bureau to determine which policies were violated with oversight from the Office of the Independent Monitor. The case is then presented to the Executive Director of Safety for a final determination on any potential discipline. The Use of Force Board may determine an additional review is required by the department's Tactics Review Board which will review this incident and determine if polities, training, and tactics need to be modified.
